Purpose of Processing Personal Data

The electronic contact form of the Terttu research, development and testing service collects information on the collaboration needs of companies, organisations and individuals. The purpose is to build research, education, development and innovation (REDI) collaboration. The collected data is used to: a) identify suitable partners within the Health Campus Turku network, b) evaluate completed collaboration, and c) develop cooperation between the contact person and the campus organisations. Submitting the contact form is voluntary.

Legal Basis for the Processing of Personal Data

The basis for the processing of personal data is consent given by the data subject.

Categories of Personal Data and Retention Periods

- Contact details
- Information about the collaboration need.

Data entered into the electronic form of Terttu, the research, development, and testing service of Health Campus Turku, will be retained for two years or for as long as active collaboration with Health Campus Turku continues and until such collaboration has been completed.

The mandatory information collected via the contact form and stored in the registry is as follows:

- first and last name
- email address
- phone number
- description of the collaboration needs

Optional information collected via the contact form:

- company name
- the municipality where the company is headquartered

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- business ID
 - company website
 - detailed description of product/solution/service
 - duration and timing of the collaboration
 - research plan
 - funding plan
 - references
 - attachments supplementing the inquiry

Regular Sources of Data

Data is collected via an online contact form managed by the University of Turku. The person contacting us fills out the form themselves. The processing of personal data is based on consent to the processing of personal data provided when filling out the form.

The coordinator at Health Campus Turku transfers the data from the electronic survey system to a separate file stored on Health Campus Turku's shared, secure Teams collaboration platform.

Recipients or Categories of Recipients of Personal Data

Personal data is stored in an electronic survey system (Webropol) and in a separate file saved on the Turku Health Campus's shared Teams collaboration platform. Webropol Oy, which provides the survey platform, acts as a data processor on behalf of the data controller. An agreement regarding the processing of personal data has been concluded between the data processor and the data controller. Personal data is processed in the Microsoft Teams service, and Microsoft acts as a data processor on behalf of the data controller pursuant to the agreement.

Personal data is processed by the coordinator and executive director of Health Campus Turku, as well as by members of the evaluation team of Terttu, Health Campus Turku's research, development, and testing service. The evaluation group consists of innovation experts from Health Campus Turku's member organizations (the University of Turku, Åbo Akademi University, Turku University of Applied Sciences, Novia University of Applied Sciences, Business Turku, and the Wellbeing Services County of Southwest Finland). In addition, personal data may be disclosed to experts and researchers at Health Campus Turku member organizations to the extent necessary to implement or evaluate potential business collaborations.

Information on the Transfer of Personal Data to Third Countries (Outside the EU or EEA)

Personal data is not transferred to third countries. Processing is carried out using Microsoft Teams, whose services are primarily provided within the EU. Access to the data from outside the EEA may be limited. The lawfulness of such transfers of personal data is based on the European Commission's decision on the adequate level of data protection in the United States when data is transferred to a certified company in the United States, such as Microsoft. Microsoft is committed to complying with the transfer mechanisms and safeguards set forth in the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) for all possible data transfers to third countries.

Principles of Data Protection

Access to the data is limited to those individuals who need it to perform their work duties.

Rights of the Data Subject

According to the General Data Protection Regulation, the data subject has the right to:

- to receive information regarding the processing of personal data, unless an exception is specifically provided for by law
- review information about themselves and correct any incorrect or missing information
- delete their data (does not apply if the basis for processing is a legal obligation or a task carried out in the public interest)
- limit the processing of their data
- object to the processing of their data if the basis for processing is a public or legitimate interest
- request that the personal data they have provided be transferred from one data controller to another, if the basis for processing is consent or a contract
- withdraw the consent they have given
- the data controller's obligation to notify regarding the rectification, erasure, or restriction of processing of personal data
- not to be subject to automated decision-making (the data subject may consent to automated decision-making)

Data subjects may use their rights by contacting the contact person or the data protection officer listed in the notice. The contact person and/or the data protection officer can provide further information about the data subject's rights.

You have the right to file a complaint with the Office of the Data Protection Ombudsman if you believe that the processing of your personal data has violated applicable data protection laws.
